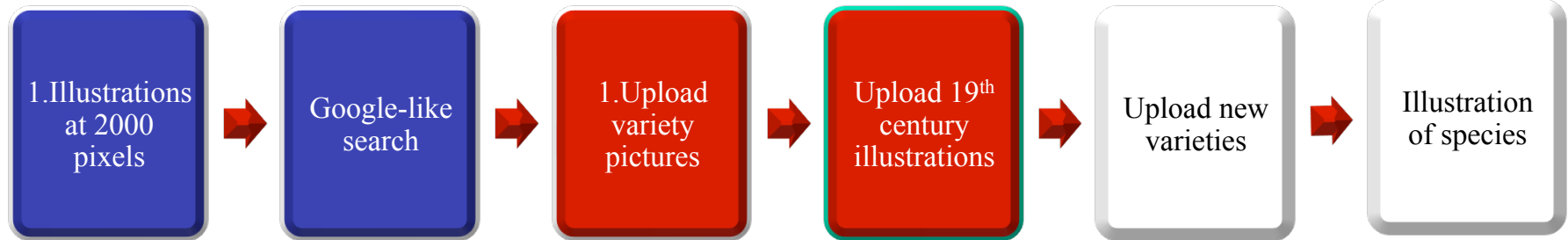



Step 1 Go to <https://internationalcamellia.org/> and click on the register button (NO log-in needed)

Privacy Policy

Option “cultivar only” / “all fields”:

- “Cultivar only” retrieves entries that match a given valid cultivar name (e.g. “Maggi”)
- «All fields» retrieves all entries which contain a given list of terms (e.g. «Maggi, japonica»)

Option «All terms/ any terms»

- «All terms» retrieves only the entries which contain all the terms listed
- «Any terms» retrieves all the entries that contain at least one of the terms listed







IN THE ABOVE EXAMPLE WE WILL RETRIEVE ALL ENTRIES THAT CONTAIN THE TERM «MAGGI»


